

Pseudoephedrine 30mg Oral Tablet

Visually Impaired

What is this medication?

Generic Name: Pseudoephedrine.

Brand Names: Sudafed®, Nexafed®, Zephrex-D® (and others).

Pseudoephedrine is an oral decongestant used to relieve: Nasal or sinus congestion due to the common cold, allergies, or sinusitis. Congestion associated with ear infections or pressure. It works by narrowing blood vessels in the nasal passages, reducing swelling and congestion.

What are the ingredients?

Active Ingredient: Pseudoephedrine hydrochloride (commonly 30 mg, 60 mg, or 120 mg per tablet depending on formulation).

What should I tell my healthcare provider before I take this medication?

Before using pseudoephedrine, inform your provider if you: Have high blood pressure or heart disease. Have glaucoma. Have overactive thyroid (hyperthyroidism). Have diabetes. Have urinary retention or prostate problems. Are taking monoamine oxidase inhibitors (MAOIs) or taking them in the last 14 days. Are pregnant or breastfeeding.

How should I use this medication?

Take exactly as directed on the label or by your provider. Swallow tablets whole with water.

Can be taken with or without food.

What if I miss a dose?

It is taken as needed for priapism as directed.



What may interact with this medication?

Always inform your provider or pharmacist if you are taking: MAO inhibitors (e.g., phenelzine, selegiline). Stimulants (e.g., amphetamines, ADHD medications). Caffeine or energy supplements. Blood pressure medications. Antidepressants or cold medications that also contain decongestants. Combining with similar medications may increase side effects like high blood pressure, palpitations, or anxiety.

Always check with your provider before starting or stopping any medication, including non-prescription products.

What side effect:

Common side effects: Nervousness or restlessness. Trouble sleeping (insomnia). Headache. Nausea. Increased heart rate

Serious side effects (seek medical help): Chest pain. Fast or irregular heartbeat. Shortness of breath. Severe dizziness or anxiety.

This list may not describe all possible side effects. Call your doctor for medical advice about side effects and any unusual problems while taking this medication. If you experience a serious side effect, you or your doctor may send a report to the Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) MedWatch Adverse Event Reporting program, online (www.fda.gov/Safety/MedWatch) or by phone (1-800-332-1088)

What should I watch while using this medication?

Monitor for increased blood pressure or heart rate if you have cardiovascular conditions. Do not take more than recommended—high doses can be dangerous. Avoid other decongestants, stimulants, or caffeine unless approved by your provider.

Where should I keep my medication?

Store at room temperature, away from moisture, heat, and direct light. Keep in a secure location away from children, pets, and unauthorized individuals.

<u>Disposal</u>: Do not flush or pour unused medication down the drain. The best option is to use a DEA-authorized drug take-back location, which you can find at <u>rxdrugdropbox.org</u>. If that's not available, mix the medication (still in its vial or drawn into a syringe) with an undesirable substance like used coffee grounds or cat litter, seal it in a plastic bag, and discard it in the household trash—after removing any personal information from the label. Used syringes must be placed in an FDA-cleared sharps container and taken to an appropriate sharps disposal site. If you're unsure, contact your pharmacist at 727-498-1228 for guidance.
