

Glutathione 200mg/mL - 30mL (SQ/IM/IV) Injection

Visually Impaired

If you are visually impaired and need help reading your label, we can help. At your request, a prescription reader is available to patients in need. What is this medication?

Glutathione is a naturally occurring antioxidant found in the body. It helps protect cells from damage caused by free radicals and supports detoxification processes in the liver. It may also play a role in immune function and cellular repair.

Compounded glutathione injections may be prescribed to support antioxidant levels, assist with detoxification, or address conditions associated with oxidative stress as determined by your healthcare provider.

This medication has been **custom-compounded** specifically for you based on a prescription from your healthcare provider.

What are the ingredients?

Glutathione 200mg/mL

What should I tell my healthcare provider before I take this medication?

Before using this medication, tell your healthcare provider if you:

- Have any allergies, especially to glutathione or other medications
- Are pregnant, planning to become pregnant, or breastfeeding
- Have asthma or respiratory conditions
- Have kidney or liver disease
- Are taking other prescription medications, supplements, or herbal products
- Have a history of sensitivity to injectable medications

Your healthcare provider will determine if this medication is appropriate for you.

How should I use this medication?

Use this medication exactly as prescribed by your healthcare provider.

What if I miss a dose?

If you miss a dose, administer it as soon as you remember unless it is almost time for your next scheduled dose.

Do **not double the dose** to make up for a missed dose. If you are unsure what to do, contact your healthcare provider or pharmacist for guidance.

What may interact with this medication?

Drug interactions are not well documented for glutathione; however, interactions may still occur.

Always check with your provider before starting or stopping any medication, including prescription drugs, over-the-counter medications, vitamins, or herbal supplements.

Always check with your provider before starting or stopping any medication, including non-prescription products.

What side effect:

Like all medications, glutathione may cause side effects. Not everyone experiences them.

Possible side effects may include:

- Injection site redness, pain, or swelling
- Mild headache
- Nausea
- Abdominal discomfort
- Allergic reactions (rare)

Seek medical attention immediately if you experience:

- Severe allergic reaction (rash, itching, swelling, dizziness, trouble breathing)
- Chest tightness or wheezing

This list may not describe all possible side effects. Call your doctor for medical advice about side effects and any unusual problems while taking this medication. If you experience a serious side effect, you or your doctor may send a report to the Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) MedWatch Adverse Event Reporting program, online (www.fda.gov/Safety/MedWatch) or by phone (1-800-332-1088)

What should I watch while using this medication?

Monitor how you feel while using this medication and report any unusual symptoms to your healthcare provider.

Contact your healthcare provider if:

- You experience persistent injection site irritation
- Your symptoms do not improve
- You experience unexpected side effects

Follow up with your healthcare provider as recommended during treatment.

Where should I keep my medication?

Store this medication in the refrigerator at 36°F to 46°F (2°C to 8°C) unless otherwise directed by your pharmacist.

Additional storage instructions:

- Protect from light if instructed.
- Do not freeze.
- Keep out of reach of children and pets.
- Do not use the medication past the beyond-use date (BUD) listed on the label.

If the solution appears cloudy, discolored, or contains particles, do not use it and contact the pharmacy.

Disposal: Do not flush or pour unused medication down the drain. The best option is to use a DEA-authorized drug take-back location, which you can find at rxdrugdropbox.org. If that's not available, mix the medication (still in its vial or drawn into a syringe) with an undesirable



substance like used coffee grounds or cat litter, seal it in a plastic bag, and discard it in the household trash—after removing any personal information from the label. Used syringes must be placed in an FDA-cleared sharps container and taken to an appropriate sharps disposal site. If you're unsure, contact your pharmacist at 727-498-1228 for guidance.
